### BRIGADE BIVOUAC

1. **GENERAL:** The Brigade Bivouac will be held on Friday, 26 September 2014 to Sunday, 28 September 2014 at Rock View Nature Park, 17800 National Trails Highway, Victorville, CA 92392. **The Bivouac will begin with cadet check in/ camp set up between 1600-1800 on Friday, 26 September 2014. Check in will take place at the top gate entering Rock View Nature Park. Pick up time on Sunday 28 September 2014 is at 1000.** If cadets are not picked up on time, that Cadet may be excluded from participating in the next Cadet event. **No cadets are to arrive before 1600 on Friday, 26 September 2014.** Parents are invited to the Awards Ceremony beginning at 0930 on Sunday 28 September 2014. Advanced party should arrive at 1400 on Friday, 26 September 2014. It is a lengthy walk from the check in area to the camp site area, please pack lightly.
2. **UNIFORM FOR BIVOUAC:** Cadets must wear their Class C Uniform (Khaki BDU) IAW CR 1-8, dated 1 December 2013 (which is available to view online at [www.cadet.org](http://www.cadet.org)). If a cadet does not have a Khaki BDU, please contact the Brigade Advisor or Brigade Support Officer, so we can locate a uniform for the cadet. We are aware that some units/cadets may not have a uniform do to supply issues; if that is the case the cadet may wear jeans, a plain solid color white shirt and a plain black baseball cap. All Cadets are reminded to be in compliance with U.S. Army hair and grooming standards. Commandant uniform is the ACU worn IAW CR 1-3 and AR 670-1. Special note to Cadet & Commandant Personnel, no berets are authorized for field use, only the Patrol Cap may be worn. (AR 670-1 paragraph 3-5)
3. **CURRICULUM FOR BIVOUAC:** Classes being taught will come from CR 3-6, Bivouacs, dated 1 May 2007. The following classes are scheduled to be taught:
  - a. Map Reading
  - b. Compass Reading
  - c. Orienteering
  - d. Basic First Aid
  - e. Team Building Activities/Leadership Reaction Courses
  - f. Guard Duty
  - g. Field Hygiene & Sanitation

4. **SUPPLIES/ EQUIPMENT:** A list of supplies/equipment cadets will need is enclosed in this circular.
5. **FOOD SERVICE:** Cadets need to bring 1 meal for Friday (26 Sep 14), 3 meals for Saturday (27 Sep 14) and 1 meal for Sunday (28 Sep 14). Cadets are authorized to bring MRE heaters, as long as they are supervised by a senior cadet, Commandant or Chaperone. A refrigerator and microwave will not be available to store/cook food, etc. Cadets should bring food that doesn't require refrigeration or heating. Cadets are encouraged to purchase Meals Ready to Eat (MRE). Hot water will be available for meals that will require hot water
6. **PERMISSION SLIPS:** Cadets will need to bring a permission slip in order to attend. Permission slips will be due upon check in at the Bivouac.
7. **MEDICATION:** If a cadet requires prescription medication, please indicate so on the Medical History form explaining the purpose and directions for administration of the medication. A Commandant or Adult Chaperone will collect these medicines and administer them IAW parent directives. Cadets requiring inhalers, "epi-pens", or other emergency medications must keep these items on their person at all times. They should NOT be turned in during check-in.
8. **TRANSPORTATION:** Each cadet is responsible for being dropped off and picked up from the bivouac.
9. **AWARDS:** All cadets attending will be awarded the Bivouac Ribbon IAW CR 1-1, dated 15 June 2014. Event Honor Unit Ribbon and Orienteering Ribbon may also be awarded.
10. **ROSTERS:** Units must submit complete rosters of all cadet personnel attending, must include their last name, first name, rank, grade and gender. Rosters are due to Brigade Headquarters NLT **17 September 2014**. Rosters can be faxed to (760) 406-5808 or emailed (preferred) to [kenneth.cookaskins@cadet.org](mailto:kenneth.cookaskins@cadet.org), [alexander.e.alaniz@gmail.com](mailto:alexander.e.alaniz@gmail.com), and [benceandrasi@hotmail.com](mailto:benceandrasi@hotmail.com). It is imperative that we receive the roster on time! Also include the name of your chaperones. Chaperons need to be cleared by the school/district they will be chaperoning for. A roster template will be emailed out NLT 5 September 2014.
11. **CHAPERONES:** Commandants are reminded to have one chaperone for each 10 participating cadets. Chaperones who are not employed by the school/district must submit all required paperwork and meet all requirements to be approved as a chaperone prior to the event.

12. **COST:** Cadets are asked to bring a donation of \$5.00 to attend the bivouac. Only cash will be accepted and receipts will be given.

13. **PARENTS:** If you have any questions about the bivouac, please contact your cadet's Commandant of Cadets. If you need to contact your cadet during the Bivouac, please contact your **cadet's Commandant of Cadets**. For the bivouac, parents/guardians cannot simply drop off their Cadets without checking them in. Parents/Guardians need to physically check in their Cadet at the Bivouac check in location at the top gate entering Rock View Nature Park. This will ensure that we have all the proper paperwork on file and filled out properly, prior to the Parent/Guardian departing the Bivouac check-in location. Parents are asked not to call Cadets during the Bivouac.

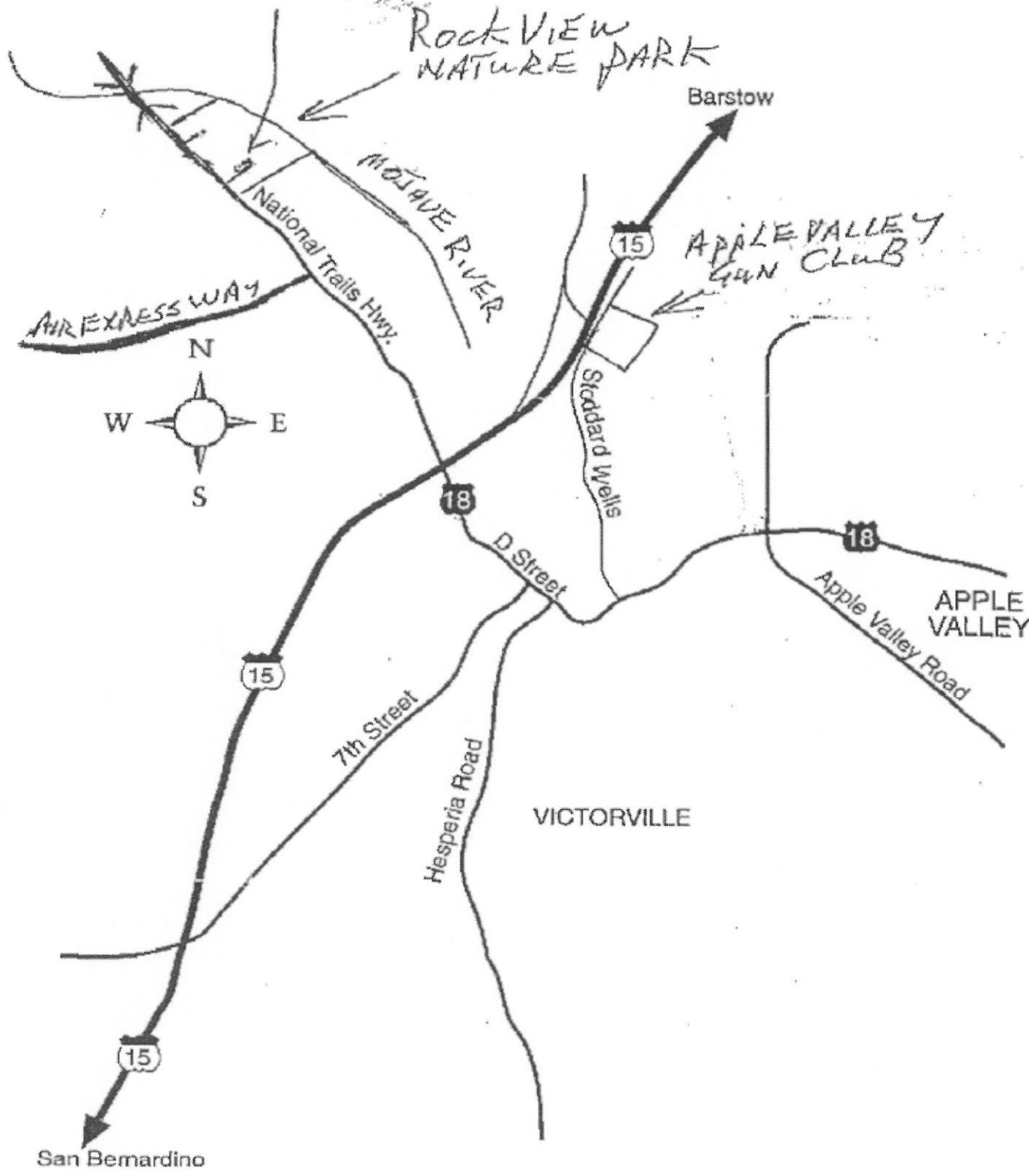

## BIVOUAC RULES

1. NO visitation by ANYONE to the camp area of the opposite sex at any time. NO EXCEPTIONS!
2. NO more than four people of the same sex may sleep in a tent at a time.
3. NO Profanity
4. Cadets must camp in their assigned areas.
5. NO unauthorized or unsupervised fire starting.
6. After lights out and going on until Reveille (wake up) the following morning, all cadets are to remain as quiet as possible.
7. An order given by a cadet who is performing night guard duty is the same as any other order- They must be followed at all times.
8. NO alcohol, tobacco, or drug products allowed (prescription medicine should be accompanied by a note from your parents).
9. Use your chain of command at all times
10. Use the buddy system at night- No more or less than two cadets of the same gender may use the latrines between lights out and reveille.
11. Failure to comply with any of these rules is grounds for immediate removal from the bivouac.
12. All school rules apply at the bivouac.
